Jeanette heard remarks from Maurice Little Wolf, an Alberta Blackfoot elder, and Dave Courchenne, an Anishnabe elder of the Eagle clan.

Jeanette. "The speakers were excellent and hearing their vision for how Indigenous teachings
can improve our country gave me hope for a renewed relationship between Indigenous and
non-Indigenous people in Canada."
